# COOPERATION BETWEEN BIOMEDICAL TRAINING PROGRAMS, A CHALLENGE FOR HEALTHCARE



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### INTRODUCTION

The lack of recognition, biomedical professionals are facing today is a major challenge to the strengthening of healthcare in low and middle income countries (LMICs). Accordingly, biomedical training programs are still **erratic** in LMICs.

In the aim of stimulating the development of such programs, the Humatem, an NGO in official relations with WHO, conducted a study on partnerships between biomedical training programs in francophone Europe and francophone Africa.




FRANCE >> 23 biomedical training programs

### DIFFERENT MOTIVATIONS

- Strengthening of the training programs
- Need for knowledgeable instructors

- Compliance of the training levels
- Common language
- Presence of an official agreement

### **CHALLENGES**

- Academic and administrative constraints
- Lack of human and financial resources
- Cultural differences

- Better qualification level of the degrees
- A solution to the lack of qualified biomedical human resources in LMICs
- Strengthening of the biomedical services in health structures
- Better understanding of the real situation of health structures internationally

- Improvement on the quality of healthcare provided and the safety of patients
